Representatives from the Village of Waynesville were present to request the Board earmark \$50,000 of the 2002 CDBG funds for their handicap ramp/ADA compliance project within the Village.  The Board stated their desire to view the proposed improvement areas and stated they would consider their request at a later time.			
Mrs. Lovely, Dearth Road resident in Clearcreek Township, was present to voice her concern relative to a neighbor operating an excavating business out of his residential property.			
She requested the Board's help in acquiring a swift and positive outcome through the Prosecutor's Office.

## PUBLIC HEARING

## ANNEXATION PETITION OF JOHN QUINN, AGENT TO ANNEX 26.842 ACRES TO THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH LEBANON

The public hearing to consider the annexation petition of John Quinn, agent to annex 26.842 acres to the Village of South Lebanon was reconvened this 31<sup>st</sup> day of August 2001, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room.

Mr. Quinn stated that the property owners have signed a pre-annexation agreement to receive water.

There was discussion relative to the County Engineer's request for the Village to provide road maintenance for the portion of Dry Run Road and Lebanon Road, which create an island for Union Township.

Mr. Quinn agreed to have the Village provide said road maintenance.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #01-1209) to approve the annexation petition subject to the Village providing road maintenance to portions of Dry Run Road and Lebanon Road.

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Lee Hamilton, developer within Turtlecreek Township, was present to register a complaint relative to a landscaping company operating from the residential zoned property adjacent to his subdivision on Greentree Road.

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The Warren County Commissioners met with the local Community Services Agency after receiving notification the day before that layoffs were eminent and senior services were in jeopardy of being discontinued due to lack of management oversight by the Executive Director, Larry Sargeant.

Commissioner Kilburn questioned "How could this happen?"

Mr. Sargeant took full responsibility for the financial deficit stating that he was concentrating on new programs within the agency and not analyzing the financial condition of existing programs including Personal Care/Homemaking, Home Delivered and Congregate Meal Service and Medical Transportation Services for the elderly. He then stated that without an additional \$200,000 from the Warren County Commissioners, layoffs and program closures were eminent.

Commissioner South questioned "how can the agency be in financial straight when this Board increased the funding 68%, from an allocation of \$431,000 in 2000 to \$725,000 in 2001?" She stated that the Community Services Agency received the largest increase given to any other office or agency within the County.

Mr. Sargeant indicated that more meals are being served than anticipated and that the number of people in need of services in general has dramatically increased.

Commissioner Crisenbery stated "seniors are an important part of our community and we have to ensure that adequate services are available to meet their needs, especially when there is not a family member around."

Dr. Charles Peckham, Chair of the Community Services Board, stated "if funding was not available from the Commissioners, they would consider proposing a senior services tax levy."

Commissioner Kilburn stated that "a tax levy would hurt the very people you are serving." He then commented that "as long as this Board is financially able to help the seniors in this County, we will do everything we can to ensure a tax levy is not imposed."

Commissioners unanimously agreed to advance the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter allocation of \$181,250 as well as an additional \$200,000 from their 2002 allocation in order for the senior citizens of the County to continue to receive the much needed services.

The Board advised Mr. Sargeant that an additional increase in next year's allocation would be considered during the budget process towards the end of the year. They urged Mr. Sargeant in the future, to take better fiscal responsibility in managing the programs to ensure this does not happen again and if need be, delegate financial analysis of programs to staff if his attention is needed elsewhere.
