DISCUSSIONS

Dave Yeggy, Daycare Catering, Inc. was present to introduce his company and stated his desire to work with the Council on Aging and/or Community Services to provide quality meals to the area Senior Citizens.

Richard Renneker, Sanitary Engineer, was present along with representatives from the Hunter Swim Club to consider the request of the Swim Club, to reduce the sanitary sewer assessment to equal a residential assessment.

Richard Renneker, Sanitary Engineer, stated that in order to assess the property a residential assessment, it will be necessary to change the water meter to a residential size meter. He stated the charge for a meter change is \$650.

Upon discussion, Commissioner Kilburn moved to waive the meter change fee and assess the property as a residential unit. The motion died for the lack of a second.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #03-1042) to allow Hunter Swim Club to pay the meter change fee on or before December 31, 2003, and assess the property as a residential unit.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.
