MINUTES FEBRUARY 8, 2005 PAGE 6 Members from the Board of Elections were present along with Christian Glass, Secretary of State's office, and Susan Johnson, Director, and Sharon Fisher, Assistant Director, to discuss the replacement of voting equipment being required by the Help America Vote Act.

Commissioner Kilburn stated he cannot support spending general fund dollars into replacing equipment that does not need to be replaced.

Commissioner Young stated his appreciation for the hard work that the Board of Elections does but does not approve of the federal mandates.

Christian Glass, Secretary of State's Office, stated that the mandate is from the Federal Government, not the State of Ohio.

Susan Johnson, Director of the Board of Elections, stated that the replacement equipment would be funded at 100%. The County will need to find a place to store the new equipment, as it will take up much more space than the existing equipment.

Commissioner Kilburn stated he does not have a problem with finding space for storage but reiterated his statement of not spending general fund dollars on the purchase of the equipment.

Upon further discussion, the Board of Elections stated they would choose their vendor later today.

Jerry Haddix, Grants Coordinator, was present at the request of the Board to discuss the 2005 Community Development Block Grant Program.

Mr. Kilburn stated his desire to consider the Morrow bike trail paving project in order to help spur economic development along the bike trail and also his desire to consider funding, in conjunction with the City of Franklin, the rehabilitation of the Franklin High School Stadium.

Upon discussion, the Board directed Mr. Haddix to contact the officials from Franklin, Franklin City Schools and the Village of Morrow to inform them of the public hearing scheduled on February 17, 2005.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.
