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Kimm Coyner, Economic Development Director, was present along with Doug Moorman and Neil Hensley, Cincinnati USA Partnership, were present to discuss the agreement between this Board and the Cincinnati USA Partnership.

Mr. Moorman stated that the Partnership has been in existence for 25 years in this region and has generated more than 800 leads within the last five years. They then stated that of the 800 leads, 84 projects have come to fruition. He then stated that the partnership is the only international outbound marketing agency for economic development in the region.

Mr. Moorman stated the benefits that Warren County received by being a \$25,000 per year partner and stated that the Board would receive many additional benefits by becoming a \$50,000 partner including a seat on the Board of Governors.

Commissioner Young questioned the number of "wins" that have come to Warren County as a direct result of our partnership in Cincinnati USA.

It was stated that Warren County is on the "short list" for an international company considering to locate here which would be a great win for the region.

Commissioner Young stated his opinion that Warren County has three options as he sees it. One is to not continue our participation in the partnership, two would be to continue at the same level and three would be to increase our funding level. He then stated that option three is definitely out given the current economic situation and the fact that Warren County has not yet seen a "win" from our partnership.

Commissioner South explained to Mr. Moorman that Warren County is in a unique location where we are in both the Cincinnati and Dayton Economic Development Region. She stated that we have to divide our funding between the two regions.

Upon further discussion, the Board requested additional statistics relative to economic development leads from the Cincinnati USA Partnership and stated that upon receipt, they will consider funding for 2009.

Richard Renneker, Sanitary Engineer, was present along with Chris Brausch, Deputy Sanitary Engineer, and Patty Solinski, Business Manager to discuss the Old 122/Utica Road Water Project.

Mrs. Solinski presented a revised survey from the residents which showed that more than 50% of the residents are in favor of the project.

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Upon discussion, the Board stated their desire to proceed to the second public hearing and reserve their right to terminate the project if, in the future, the Board determines that the costs are out of line due to the economy or higher than expected construction costs.

Mrs. Solinski then stated that, upon audit of as assessment account, it has been determined that incorrect non-participant charges were levied to certain property owners within the 1993 water line project on Lower Springboro Road.

Mrs. Solinski explained that not only were the wrong amounts collected but the fees that were collected were not paid towards the bond retirement. She then stated that she is working with the County Auditor and the Prosecutor's Office to determine if and how much property owners are owed in the form of a refund due to the Water Department error.

Mrs. Solinski then stated that they are already researched and determined two property owners refund amounts.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #08-1531) to approve a Supplemental Appropriation within the Debt Retirement Fund 327 and an Operating Transfer from Water Fund 510 into Debt Retirement Fund 327-3249 Lower Springboro Road Water Line Assessment and approve Refunds for customers that were assessed as part of a 1993 Special Assessment Bond Issue for Water Improvements on Lower Springboro Road.
